Bruce discussed the issue with Rachel. They both were determined to make a difference. They joined forces to raise awareness about the issue, organized food drives, and volunteered at homeless shelters. Their efforts contributed to a movement for change. People from all walks of life came together to demand equal opportunities for every citizen. Through perseverance and solidarity, Rachel and Bruce's acts blossomed into a lighthouse of hope for the marginalized(边缘化的).

C

Children tend to be attracted to animals and love them. Adults guide them to care for companion animals; to love, feed, and pamper(娇养) dogs and cats and make sure they are not harmed. At the same time, we live in a society that teaches us that it is okay to eat pigs for breakfast, chickens for lunch, and cows for dinner. In Canada, more than 800 million land animals are killed for food each year and in the United States, 55 billion animals annually. (Consider at the same time, that people take their pet dog to a spa. Tests show pigs to be easily as intelligent as dogs.)

In *King Zoom the Vegan Kid*, author Gillian Walters tackles issues of dietary choice in a clear, honest, non-shaming and sympathetic way. This book explains the what, why, and how of veganism(素食主义).

In recent years, the number of self-identified vegans has increased dramatically, particularly among young adults. The scientific evidence of factory farming's impact on the environment and the health benefits of plant-based diets can no longer be ignored. And there has never been an easier time to be vegan, with so many delicious options available.

Many youngsters who care about farm animals and wonder why our society treats them so differently from those we classify as pets will appreciate an age-appropriate resource of this book. They may be asked "Why are you vegan?" They may value support for their dietary choice.

An excellent resource for a child is Gillian Walters' book, based on her own experiences and also on those of her son. In it, King Zoom shares real-life farm animal rescue stories. Including the story of Penny, a piglet who jumped off the back of a truck that was speeding her towards her doom(厄运). This pig was picked up by a good Samaritan and she now lives happily at the RASTA sanctuary(避难所) in Duncan, British Columbia. People typically do not recognize that pigs are feeling animals with the intelligence of a 3-year-old. They can play computer games with a joystick adapted for their use. People often begin to shift their dietary choices when they begin to see other species as similar to the cat or dog in their family.

King Zoom explores options for activism, how to live with others whose dietary choices are different from his own, and how to take care of his own feelings around topics that arise.

D

Obesity and diabetes(糖尿病) have affected more young people, with many taking to social media platforms to share their symptoms of being diagnosed with diabetes at a young age.

Guo Xiaohui, a senior doctor at the endocrinology(内分泌学) department of Peking University First Hospital, told that 20 years ago, none of her diabetic patients were under 30, but nowadays, around 20 percent of them are under 30.

Yao Qiyan, a senior doctor at Huashan Hospital of Fudan University's department of obesity and hernia(疝气), said there are diabetes patients who are in middle school or even primary school in recent years, some of whom are obese and have high blood pressure.

It is common knowledge in medicine that obesity is one of the major causes of diabetes and cardiovascular(心血管) diseases. According to a 2020 report on Chinese people's nutrition level and chronic diseases released by the National Health Commission, around 10 percent of children under the age of 6 are obese, which increased to almost 20 percent for children aged between 6 and 17.

Xie Zhuangli, a doctor at Tongji Hospital of Tongji University's department of endocrinology and metabolism(代谢), said that when young people suffer from chronic diseases such as diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and high blood pressure, their chances of suffering complications(并发症) are significantly higher than those of older people. For example, for diabetes, it takes, on average, five to 10 years for patients to develop complications after they are diagnosed, so young people are more likely to have complications.

Experts said the reason for the increasing number of young people who have diabetes is that they eat food with lots of oil and sugar and have an unhealthy daily schedule. Some beverage brands have become so popular among young people that many of them seldom drink water, they said. More importantly, they lack knowledge about chronic diseases and often think that only older people suffer from such diseases, Xie said. Many young diabetic patients go to the hospital for treatment after they develop serious complications and it is often too late for effective intervention, she said.

Yao suggested that more efforts should be made to increase health education among teenagers, monitor children's diets, and ensure that they have enough time for sports every day.

Motivation isn't something just bound to leaders or a workplace, it is something that is present in all of us. Our parents motivate us, our friends do, and everyone does it. There must always be a reason to do something in life, may it be in our professional and personal lives, that nudge is called motivation. 36 Here are some of the characteristics that you should know about.

Empowerment

Empowerment is the main characteristic of motivated leaders. Leaders who are motivated will empower their employees by providing them with responsibility and autonomy. You need to give your employees a sense of freedom. They need to know that they can handle things on their own. 37 This will motivate them to be better.

Communication

Needless to say, effective communication is a must if you want your workforce to be motivated, and that too for a long period of time. Listen to their needs and then convey your needs. 38 Leaders communicate the purpose and significance of tasks and projects, making team members understand why their contributions matter.

Recognition and Reward

There cannot be any kind of motivation without proper recognition and reward. May it be any kind of workforce, they need a reason to perform better. 39 This can include both intrinsic rewards (like praise and acknowledgment) and extrinsic rewards (such as bonuses or promotions).

Long-Term Focus

Motivation needs to be there for a long time, short-term performance boosts are not sustainable after all. Motivation is typically focused on the long-term development and growth of team members. 40
